-- There was an "atmosphere of panic" from his headquarters. Besides his sobbing over Loeb, "his left eye twitched nervously and his hands shook uncontrollably during the New Hampshire TV debate."--

It was noted that Senator Muskie may have an emotional problem as evidenced by the above.
