This will confirm our several conversations of Monday, October 29, Tuesday, October 30, and Wednesday, October 31, resulting in our offering to give the California Republican Campaign Committee comparable opportunity for appropriate spokesmen to present opposing views to those discussed over the station on the Pamela Mason program and on the Paul Coates program of August 9, September 7 and October 10, 1962.

This letter will confirm that you have decided to have spokesmen appear on the Paul Coates program of Thursday, November 1 and Friday, November 2, to answer the partisan comments made on the two programs of August 9 and October 10. In addition, the last fifteen-minute segment of the Pamela Mason program on Friday, November 2 will be made available to you. We understand you wish to broadcast a fifteen-minute segment of the recent Eisenhower speech made on behalf of Mr. Nixon, which you consider will give you a comparable opportunity to answer the partisan statements made by Pamela Mason during the past few weeks on behalf of Governor Brown.

We have heretofore delivered to you transcripts of the Paul Coates programs as well as the pertinent transcripts of the Pamela Mason program.

It is understood that this letter shall confirm our understanding that the time that you and we have agreed upon shall be all-inclusive as to comments made on the station up to the present time.

If the occasion should arise between now and election day where KTTV might agree that comparable opportunities should be given to you for any additional partisan statements made over KTTV other than on paid commercial time, KTTV will arrange for the opportunity for spokesmen of Mr. Nixon to reply.

THIS IS WITH REFERENCE TO (A) THE COMMISSION'S LETTER OF SEPTEMBER 26, 1962, REQUESTING YOUR COMMENTS CONCERNING THE COMPLAINT OF MR. WILLIAM K. COBLENTZ, SPECIAL COUNSEL FOR THE CALIFORNIA STATE DEMOCRATIC COMMITTEE, THAT YOU HAVE NOT COMPLIED WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE QUOTE FAIRNESS DOCTRINE UNQUOTE WITH RESPECT TO CERTAIN PROGRAMS OF TOM DUGGAN AND GEORGE PUTNAM CONCERNING THE CALIFORNIA GUBERNATORIAL CAMPAIGN; AND (B) YOUR RESPONSE THERETO OF OCTOBER 15, 1962.

YOUR RESPONSE INQUIRES WHETHER THE COMMISSION HAS CHANGED ITS POLICY CONCERNING QUOTE NO CENSORSHIP UNQUOTE OF STATION'S PROGRAMMING. THERE HAS BEEN NO CHANGE IN OUR POLICY ON THIS IMPORTANT MATTER. THERE IS NO QUESTION AS TO YOUR COMPLETE AND UNFETTERED RIGHT TO CARRY THE VIEWS OF MR. DUGGAN, MR. PUTNAM, AND ANY OTHERS YOU CHOOSE TO PRESENT. BUT NEITHER HAS THERE BEEN ANY CHANGE IN THE COMMISSION'S LONG-STANDING

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QUOTE FAIRNESS UNQUOTE POLICY AND ITS STANDARD PROCEDURES THEREUNDER. THAT POLICY, WHICH THE CONGRESS HAS EXPRESSLY INCORPORATED INTO SECTION 315 OF THE COMMUNICATIONS ACT, REQUIRES A QUOTE FAIR AND BALANCED PRESENTATION UNQUOTE OF VIEWPOINTS CONCERNING ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ CONTROVERSIAL ISSUES OF PUBLIC IMPORTANCE, PARTICULARLY WHERE PERSONAL ATTACKS ARE INVOLVED (PARS. 9, 10, EDITORIALIZING REPORT). SPECIFICALLY, UNDER THE FAIRNESS DOCTRINE, WHEN A BROADCAST STATION PERMITS, OVER ITS STATION FACILITIES, A COMMENTATOR OR ANY PERSON OTHER THAN A CANDIDATE TO TAKE A PARTISAN POSITION ON THE ISSUES INVOLVED IN A RACE FOR POLITICAL OFFICE AND/OR TO ~~XXXXXXXX~~ ONE CANDIDATE OR SUPPORT ANOTHER BY DIRECT OR INDIRECT IDENTIFICATION, THEN IT SHOULD SEND A TRANSCRIPT OF THE PERTINENT CONTINUITY IN EACH SUCH PROGRAM TO THE APPROPRIATE CANDIDATES IMMEDIATELY AND SHOULD OFFER A COMPARABLE OPPORTUNITY FOR AN APPROPRIATE SPOKESMAN TO ANSWER THE BROADCAST. (C.F. BILLINGS BROADCASTING CO., 23 PIKE AND FISCHER, R.R. 951, 953.) IT IS THIS QUOTE FAIRNESS UNQUOTE

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POLICY WHICH MUST BE APPLIED TO THE FACTS OF THE PRESENT COMPLAINT.

IN THE COMMISSION'S LETTER, YOU WERE ADVISED, IN EFFECT, THAT THE COMPLAINT WAS GROUNDED UPON THE ALLEGATION THAT WHILE TOM DUGGAN AND, ON OCCASION, GEORGE PUTNAM HAVE PRESENTED THEIR VIEWS CONCERNING THE CAMPAIGN AND THE CANDIDATES AND ISSUES THEREIN, VIEWPOINTS OPPOSED TO THOSE OF MR. DUGGAN AND MR. PUTNAM WITH RESPECT TO THE CAMPAIGN HAD NOT BEEN BROADCAST. YOU WERE FURTHER ADVISED THAT MR. COBLENTZ WAS COMPLAINING, IN PARTICULAR, OF SEVEN DIFFERENT BROADCASTS OF MR. DUGGAN AND TWO OF MR. PUTNAM. INFORMATION SUBSEQUENTLY COMING TO THE ATTENTION OF THE COMMISSION HAS INDICATED THAT IN ADDITION TO SUCH BROADCASTS MR. DUGGAN HAS PRESENTED HIS VIEWS CONCERNING THE CAMPAIGN IN MANY OTHER BROADCASTS, AND THAT, IN ALL, MORE THAN TWENTY DIFFERENT BROADCASTS HAVE INVOLVED THE PRESENTATION OF THE VIEWS OF MESSRS. DUGGAN AND PUTNAM ON THE CAMPAIGN. THERE IS ATTACHED HERETO A LIST OF THE BROADCASTS IN QUESTION AND BRIEF SUMMARIES OF WHAT IS ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN DISCUSSED THEREIN, AND, AS YOU WILL NOTE THEREFROM, IT APPEARS THAT SUBSTANTIAL AMOUNTS OF

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BROADCAST TIME WERE DEVOTED TO THE VIEWS OF DUGGAN AND PUTNAM ON THE CAMPAIGN AND THAT THE PROGRAMS INVOLVED THE DISCUSSION OF NUMEROUS ISSUES.

IN YOUR REPLY YOU LIST A NUMBER OF PROGRAMS FEATURING VARIOUS SPOKESMEN FOR THE DEMOCRATIC PARTY PRESENTING THEIR VIEWS ON VARIOUS STATE AND NATIONAL ISSUES. HOWEVER, THE MATTERS RAISED BY THE COMPLAINANT HEREIN RELATE SPECIFICALLY TO THE GUBERNATORIAL CAMPAIGN BETWEEN GOVERNOR BROWN AND MR. NIXON AND THE ISSUES RAISED IN THE CAMPAIGN.

WITH THIS AS BACKGROUND, YOUR RESPONSE INDICATES THAT SINCE AUGUST 27, 1962, THE DATE OF THE FIRST DUGGAN BROADCAST OF WHICH MR. COBLENTZ COMPLAINS, THERE WERE TWO INSTANCES OF BROADCASTS FEATURING GOVERNOR BROWN; BUT THE FIRST COUNTER-BALANCED THE APPEARANCE OF MR. NIXON AND THE SECOND GAVE RISE TO AN QUOTE EQUAL OPPORTUNITY UNQUOTE FOR MR. NIXON. IN ADDITION, THERE WERE TWO INSTANCES OF BROADCASTS DEVOTED TO THE PRESENTATION OF VIEWPOINTS CONCERNING THE GUBERNATORIAL CAMPAIGN OPPOSED TO THOSE WHICH HAD BEEN PREVIOUSLY

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PRESENTED ON THE DUGGAN AND PUTNAM PROGRAMS. THESE BROADCASTS APPEAR TO HAVE DEALT WITH A DISCUSSION OF TWO ISSUES, --DONALD NIXON-HUGHES TOOL CO. LOAN AND THE ALLEGED COMMUNIST INFILTRATION OF THE CALIFORNIA DEMOCRATIC COUNCIL. IT DOES NOT APPEAR FROM YOUR RESPONSE THAT ANY OF THE OTHER BROADCASTS LISTED DEALT WITH THE ISSUES CONCERNING THE GUBERNATORIAL CAMPAIGN; IF THEY DID, PLEASE SO ADVISE, WITH SPECIFIC DETAILS AS TO SUCH BROADCASTS, THE ISSUES DEALT WITH, AND THE AMOUNT OF TIME DEVOTED TO SUCH ISSUES.

THERE REMAINS FOR THE COMMISSION'S CONSIDERATION THE TWO INSTANCES MENTIONED ABOVE WHICH INVOLVED THE PRESENTATION OF VIEWPOINTS CONCERNING THE GUBERNATORIAL CAMPAIGN OPPOSED TO THOSE OF MESSRS. PUTNAM AND DUGGAN VIS A VIS THE MORE THAN TWENTY DIFFERENT PROGRAMS OF MESSRS. PUTNAM AND DUGGAN, WHICH PRESENTED THE VIEWS OF THE AFOREMENTIONED PERSONS ON MANY DIFFERENT ISSUES OF THE CAMPAIGN FOR WHICH NO OPPORTUNITY APPEARS TO HAVE BEEN AFFORDED FOR THE

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PRESENTATION OF OPPOSING VIEWPOINTS.

AS IS SHOWN ABOVE AND BY THE ATTACHED SUMMARY, IT DOES NOT APPEAR THAT THERE WAS A FAIR OPPORTUNITY FOR PRESENTATION OF OPPOSING VIEWPOINTS WITH RESPECT TO MANY OF THE ISSUES DISCUSSED IN THE DUGGAN AND PUTNAM PROGRAMS. THE CONTINUOUS, REPETITIVE OPPORTUNITY AFFORDED FOR THE EXPRESSION OF THE VIEWPOINTS OF DUGGAN AND PUTNAM ON THE GUBERNATORIAL CAMPAIGN, IN CONTRAST TO THE MINIMAL OPPORTUNITY AFFORDED TO OPPOSING VIEWPOINTS, WOULD APPEAR TO VIOLATE THE RIGHT OF THE PUBLIC TO A FAIR PRESENTATION OF VIEWS. FURTHER, AS THE ATTACHED SUMMARY INDICATES, IT HAS BEEN ALLEGED THAT MR. DUGGAN HAS, FROM TIME TO TIME, BROADCAST PERSONAL ATTACKS ON INDIVIDUALS AND GROUPS INVOLVED IN THE GUBERNATORIAL CAMPAIGN, AND SPECIFICALLY ON GOVERNOR BROWN. AS WE HAVE STATED, FAIRNESS REQUIRES THAT WHEN A BROADCAST STATION PERMITS, OVER ITS FACILITIES, A COMMENTATOR OR ANY PERSON OTHER THAN A CANDIDATE, TO TAKE A PARTISAN POSITION ON THE ISSUES INVOLVED IN A RACE FOR POLITICAL OFFICE AND/OR TO ATTACK ONE CANDIDATE OR SUPPORT ANOTHER BY DIRECT OR INDIRECT

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IDENTIFICATION, THEN IT SHOULD SEND A TRANSCRIPT OF THE PERTINENT CONTINUITY ON EACH SUCH PROGRAM TO THE APPROPRIATE CANDIDATE IMMEDIATELY ~~BY TELEPHONE~~ AND SHOULD OFFER A COMPARABLE OPPORTUNITY FOR AN APPROPRIATE SPOKESMAN TO ANSWER THE BROADCAST. CF. IN RE APPLICATION OF CLAYTON H. MAPOLES, 23 PIKE & FISCHER, R.R. 586, 591; BILLINGS BROADCASTING COMPANY, 23 PIKE & FISCHER, R.R. 951, 953.

IN VIEW OF THE FOREGOING, YOU ARE REQUESTED TO SUBMIT, BY THE END OF THE DAY ON MONDAY, OCTOBER 22, 1962, AN ADDITIONAL STATEMENT IN THE MATTER, WHICH SHOULD INCLUDE THE STEPS YOU HAVE TAKEN, OR PROPOSE TO TAKE IN THE IMMEDIATE FUTURE TO PERMIT THE PRESENTATION OF OPPOSING VIEWPOINTS IN THIS MATTER.

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SUMMARY OF PROGRAMS

AUGUST 27, 1962

DUGGAN — STATED THAT THE DEMOCRATS HAVE GRIED "SNEAR" OVER EVERYTHING NIXON HAS SAID BUT NOW IT WAS NIXON'S TURN. "IT IS AN AMAZING THING HOW MUCH MAD THE DEMOCRATS HAVE THROWN."

WITH RESPECT TO A LABOR CONVENTION HELD AT LONG BEACH, CALIFORNIA, DUGGAN STATED THAT BROWN HAD CALLED NIXON A "COWARD" FOR NOT ATTENDING WHEN BROWN KNEW THAT NIXON COULD NOT HAVE ATTENDED EVEN IF HE SO DESIRED.

WITH RESPECT TO THE BIRCH SOCIETY, DUGGAN STATED THAT: "WHY DON'T THEY [THE DEMOCRATS] KEEP THE COMMUNISTS OUT OF THEIR PARTY?"

FUTNAM — STATED THAT GEORGE MILLER, A DEMOCRAT STATE SENATOR, WAS QUOTED AS SAYING "AT BEST WE HAVE NO MORE THAN THIRTY-FIVE COMMUNISTS IN CALIFORNIA'S DEMOCRATIC ORGANIZATION."

WITH RESPECT TO THE HUGHES' LOAN FROM THE HUGHES TOOL COMPANY TO MR. DONALD NIXON, DUGGAN QUOTED A NIXON SPOKESMAN WHO STATED THAT "THIS IS OLD, VERY TIRED AND UNPRODUCTIVE BROWN AND IF THIS IS ALL BROWN AND HIS HENCHMEN HAVE TO TALK ABOUT IN THEY ARE IN SERIOUS TROUBLE."

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WITH RESPECT TO CERTAIN AUTOMOBILE BUMPER STRIPS WHICH APPARENTLY READ "IS EDWIN PINK?", FURMAN QUOTED A DEMOCRATIC SENATOR WHO STATED "I CAN'T RECALL ANYONE EVER ASKING DUNCAN HOW HE IS PINK."

SEPTEMBER 1, 1962

DUGGAN -- DEVOTED A SUBSTANTIAL AMOUNT OF TIME (ABOUT THREE PAGES OF A SINGLE SPACED TYPEWRITTEN SCRIPT) TO THE INSTITUTE OF PACIFIC RELATIONS. DUGGAN STATED THAT THE INSTITUTE IS HEADED BY FREDERICK V. FIELDS, WHOM DUGGAN CALLS "A KNOWN COINER" AND OWEN LATTORE, WHOM DUGGAN CONSIDERS A LEADING MEMBER OF THE COMMUNIST CONSPIRACY. AFTER ATTACKING THE INSTITUTE AT GREAT LENGTH, AND ATTACKING THOSE ORGANIZATIONS (SUCH AS THE LEFF, INC., ROCKEFELLER FOUNDATION, ETC.) AND PERSONS WHO SUPPORT THE INSTITUTE, DUGGAN STATED THAT ANYONE WHO SUPPORTED THE INSTITUTE OR WHO HELD STOCK IN A CORPORATION THAT SUPPORTED THE INSTITUTE, WAS SHAKING OUT THE UNITED STATES. DUGGAN STATED THAT THE INSTITUTE IS IN PART RESPONSIBLE FOR THE IMAGE THAT EDWIN IS A MAN WHO CAN'T BE TRUSTED AND THAT THE INSTITUTE HAS SPOILED EDWIN'S CHARACTER.

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SEPTEMBER 4, 1962

DUGGAN -- ~~INTERVIEW~~ ^{INTERVIEW} ~~INTERVIEW~~ JOHN ROUSSELOT, MEMBER OF CONGRESS, CONCERNING AMERICANS THE CONNECTION BETWEEN THE ~~(ADULTERAN)~~ FOR DEMOCRATIC ACTION AND GOVERNOR BROWN, AND STANLEY MOSK, THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OF CALIFORNIA. DURING THE INTERVIEW IT WAS STATED THAT ADA "PULLS THE STRING ON BROWN AND MOSK."

SEPTEMBER 5, 1962

DUGGAN -- STATES HE IS SUPPORTING NIXON AND REFERS TO BROWN AS THE "PORTLAND, PAINTING GOVERNOR."

SEPTEMBER 7, 1962

DUGGAN -- SUPPORTS NIXON ON LOAN FROM THE HUGHES TOOL COMPANY TO HIS BROTHER. STATES THAT THE LOAN IS "ONLY USED AS A SHIELD" AGAINST NIXON.

SEPTEMBER 8, 1962

DUGGAN -- CONDUCTS INTERVIEW WITH TELEPHONE CALLERS. IN ANSWER TO QUESTION WHETHER GOVERNOR BROWN IS A NATIVE CALIFORNIAN, DUGGAN STATED THAT HE WAS, WHICH "JUST SHOWS YOU THAT LOTS OF THINGS CAN HAPPEN IN CALIFORNIA." DUGGAN FURTHER STATED THAT "IF HE'S GOT SOME SORT OF PROGRAM I WISH HE'D TELL US ABOUT IT, INSTEAD OF MENTIONING NIXON CONSTANTLY AND WHAT NIXON IS DOING

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TO HIM." FINALLY, DUGGAN STATED THAT NIXON IS ATTACKED FOR WHAT OTHERS CAN GET AWAY WITH.

SEPTEMBER 10, 1962

DUGGAN -- INTERVIEWED AN ALLEGED FORMER MEMBER OF THE COMMUNIST PARTY OF THE UNITED STATES WHO SPOKE OF ALLEGED COMMUNIST INFILTRATION OF THE CALIFORNIA DEMOCRATIC CLUBS. THE INTERVIEWEE STATED THAT HE ATTENDED MEETINGS OF THE COMMUNIST PARTY WHERE INFILTRATION TACTICS WERE DISCUSSED AND THAT INFILTRATION HAD BEEN ACCOMPLISHED.

SEPTEMBER 11, 1962

DUGGAN -- IMPLIES STRONGLY THAT CALIFORNIA DEMOCRATS ARE UN-AMERICAN AND THAT THEIR VIEWS ARE "FOREIGN".

SEPTEMBER 13, 1962

DUGGAN -- "HE [DROWN] HAS A NICE RECORD. HE'S NEVER BEEN IN JAIL."

SEPTEMBER 15, 1962

DUGGAN -- DISCUSSING HARRY S. TRUMAN'S CAMPAIGN VISIT TO CALIFORNIA, STATES THAT TRUMAN, IN HIS REMARKS ABOUT NIXON, HAS BEHAVED LIKE A SPOILED BRAT AND A POLECON THUG. DUGGAN SEES THIS AS A REFLECTION OF THE DEMOCRATS' WISH TO SEE NIXON DESTROYED. DUGGAN SAYS THE REASON FOR THIS FEELING IS: "BECAUSE THE LONGER

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~~HE~~ ^{STAYS} ~~IN~~ PUBLIC LIFE—AND GOD HELP THE LIBERALS IF HE IS EVER
 ELECTED PRESIDENT—BECAUSE THEN PERHAPS WE WILL HAVE SOME
 INVESTIGATIONS THAT WILL SHOW THEM FOR WHAT THEY ARE." HE
 IMPLIED THAT NEON WAS THE ONLY CANDIDATE CONCERNED WITH PRESERVING
 THE CONSTITUTION, INSTITUTIONS AND SOVEREIGNTY OF THE UNITED
 STATES.

SEPTEMBER 17, 1962

DUGAN — QUOTES AN ARTICLE PRINTED IN THE CITIZEN'S UNITED
 PRESS, INC. THIS ARTICLE, OSTENSIBLY SIGNED BY THREE FORMER
 UNDERCOVER AGENTS FOR THE FBI, ATTESTS TO THE FACT THAT THEY
 HAVE PERSONAL KNOWLEDGE OF MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNIST PARTY AS WELL
 AS THOSE FURTHERING COMMUNIST CAUSES ACTUALLY JOINING AND ACTING
 AS OFFICERS, DELEGATES AND MEMBERS OF THE CALIFORNIA DEMOCRATIC
 COUNCIL. DUGAN NAMES SEVERAL PERSONS WHO HAVE ACTED AS AGENTS
 FOR THE FBI AND SAYS "THEY [THE DEMOCRATS] CAN GO TO THESE
 PERSONS — WHO CAN IDENTIFY -- HAVE IDENTIFIED THE VARIOUS

DUGGAN -- COMMENTS THAT BROWN IS MAD AT NIXON BECAUSE OF NIXON'S TREATMENT OF HELEN GAHAGEN DOUGLAS. HE STATES THAT IF MRS. DOUGLAS WAS NOT SOFT ON COMMUNISM SHE WAS IGNORANT OF IT AND THAT ". . . SHE WASN'T REALLY CAPABLE OF HOLDING THE OFFICE FOR WHICH SHE WAS ASPIRING." HE THEN STATES THAT BROWN, AS ATTORNEY GENERAL OF THE STATE, ISSUED A PAMPHLET INTENDED TO BE A GUIDE FOR ALL POLICE OFFICERS IN THE STATE ON RACE RELATIONS. DUGGAN SAYS THAT THE LEXICOGRAPHY FOR THIS GUIDE CONTAINED A LARGE NUMBER OF WORDS BY "COMMUNISTS, FELLOW TRAVELERS, PRO-COMMUNISTS . . . WILD IRRED LIBERALS." STATES THAT BROWN WAS EITHER SOFT ON COMMUNISM WHEN HE ISSUED THE PAMPHLET OR HE COULDN'T SPELL COMMUNISM. CONCLUDED BY SAYING "HE IS ONE OF THE GREATEST IGNORANCES ON COMMUNISM THAT EVER LIVED OR HE IS SOFT ON IT." DURING THE PROGRAM, DUGGAN QUOTED STATE ASSEMBLYMAN LOUIS FRANCIS AS SAYING

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"THE GOVERNOR'S POSITION IS NOT SURPRISING IN VIEW OF HIS BACKGROUND OF APATHY AND UNCONCERN ABOUT COMMUNISM AND SUBVERSION."

SEPTEMBER 21, 1962

DUGGAN — QUOTED NIXON AS SAYING "I WANT THE GOVERNMENT TO TAKE LESS FROM THE PEOPLE SO THAT THE PEOPLE WILL HAVE MORE TO SPEND ON THEMSELVES." THEN DEPRECIATES BROWN'S RESPONSE WHICH SETS FORTH THE REASONS FOR TAXATION. CONCLUDES BY STATING THAT IF BROWN IS ELECTED THE STATE WILL REQUIRE ADDITIONAL MENTAL HEALTH CLINICS.

SEPTEMBER 22, 1962

DUGGAN — QUOTING NIXON'S ATTITUDE TOWARD BROWN'S FEELINGS ON SUBVERSIVES STATES: "NIXON FEELS BROWN WOULDN'T KNOW A SUBVERSIVE IF ONE CAME UP AND HIT HIM." STATES THAT DURING BROWN'S FOUR YEARS AS GOVERNOR SOME ". . . HIGHLY QUESTIONABLE PEOPLE THAT HAVE BEEN — REFUSED TO ANSWER QUESTIONS BEFORE AN INVESTIGATING COMMITTEE ON COMMUNISM . . ." HAVE GIVEN SPEECHES ON UNIVERSITY CAMPUSES.

SEPTEMBER 24, 1962

DUGGAN — COMMENTING ON BROWN'S REQUESTS FOR FEDERAL AID IN DEALING WITH THE CALIFORNIA CRIME PROBLEM AND MAYOR YORTY'S CONFERENCE WITH ROBERT KENNEDY ON THE MOSLEMS IN LOS ANGELES,

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DUGGAN WANTED TO KNOW WHAT BROWN AND THE OTHERS HAD BEEN ELECTED FOR IF THEY WERE GOING TO GO ~~TO~~^{WENTING} TO WASHINGTON FOR HELP. HE NOTES THAT A GROUP HAD BEEN FORMED TO RUN ADLAI STEVENSON FOR GOVERNOR. HE ASKS WHAT IT WOULD BE LIKE WITH STEVENSON AS GOVERNOR AND ANSWERS THE QUESTION BY STATING THAT IT COULD BE ANOTHER CURA.

SEPTEMBER 25, 1962

DUGGAN -- STATES THAT THE CALIFORNIA DEMOCRATIC PARTY IS NOT REALLY A DEMOCRATIC PARTY. IT SHOULD BE MORE PROPERLY CALLED A LIBERAL PARTY. HE COMPARES IT TO THE ILLINOIS DEMOCRATIC PARTY AND SAYS ALTHOUGH THAT STATE PARTY WAS ~~NOT~~^{NOT} SO "HOLY" AT LEAST IT WASN'T INTERNATIONAL BROTHERHOOD. HE STATES THAT THE CDC GROUP IN CALIFORNIA IS ACTUALLY AN ADLAI STEVENSON GROUP AND THIS WAS DISCREDITED BY THE FACT THAT HALF THE CALIFORNIA DELEGATION TO THE DEMOCRATIC NATIONAL CONVENTION VOTED FOR STEVENSON.

SEPTEMBER 1, 1962

CONCERNING RICHARD NIXON'S REMARK THAT STATE ASSEMBLYMAN BURTON WAS PRESENT AT THE SAN FRANCISCO RIOTS, A CHARGE WHICH BURTON DENIED, DUGGAN STATED THAT HE BELIEVED BURTON WAS PRESENT AT THE RIOT AND THAT BROWN HAD STATED THAT BURTON'S WORK IN THE LEGISLATURE

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WAS EXCELLENT. "HE WAS FOR THE SICK AND THE LAME AND THE LAME AND HE LIKES 'EM." AND "IF BURTON SAYS HE WASN'T THERE, WHY, WE'LL HAVE TO FIND OUT WHO WAS."

OCTOBER 3, 1962

DUGGAN — STATES THAT HE IS PRESENTING A MEMBER OF THE STATE AND COUNTY DEMOCRATIC PARTIES IN ORDER TO MAINTAIN A NON-PARTISAN POSITION. THE DEMOCRAT WAS A MR. ROBERT KIBERHALL. UPON BEING QUESTIONED, MR. KIBERHALL STATED THAT HE WAS CRITICAL OF BROWN'S ATTITUDE TOWARD THE MEXICAN-AMERICAN COMMUNITY^N IN CALIFORNIA BECAUSE, DESPITE THE FACT THAT THIS GROUP HAS BEEN LOYAL TO THE DEMOCRATIC PARTY, BROWN HAD APPOINTED ONLY 22 MEXICAN-AMERICANS TO POSITIONS IN THE STATE GOVERNMENT. MR. KIBERHALL STATED THAT HE IS URGING THE MEXICAN-AMERICAN COMMUNITY IN HIS DISTRICT TO ABSTAIN FROM VOTING FOR PAT BROWN ALTHOUGH HE IS ASKING THEM TO SUPPORT EVERY OTHER DEMOCRATIC CANDIDATE.

COMMENTING ON THE ACLU'S POSITION WITH RESPECT TO THE RELEASE OF GENERAL WALKER FROM A FEDERAL HOSPITAL, DUGGAN SAYS THAT IT IS AMAZING HOW PERBERTON (JOHN PERBERTON, JR., EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF

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THE ACLU AND A REPUBLICAN), PAT BROWN AND THE CDC AND OTHERS CAN
EQUATE THE JOHN BIRCH SOCIETY WITH COMMUNISM OR FASCISM.

RE THE EXCHANGE OF CORRESPONDENCE RELATING TO THE COMPLAINT OF MR. WILLIAM K. COBLENTZ, SPECIAL COUNSEL FOR THE CALIFORNIA STATE DEMOCRATIC COMMITTEE, THAT YOU HAVE NOT COMPLIED WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE QUOTE FAIRNESS DOCTRINE UNQUOTE WITH RESPECT TO CERTAIN PROGRAMS OF TOM DUGGAN AND GEORGE PUTNAM CONCERNING THE CALIFORNIA GUBERNATORIAL CAMPAIGN.

IN THE COMMISSION'S TELEGRAM OF OCTOBER 19, 1962, YOU WERE ADVISED THAT THE ABOVE-MENTIONED PROGRAMS APPEARED TO HAVE INVOLVED QUOTE CONTINUOUS UNQUOTE AND QUOTE REPETITIVE UNQUOTE OPPORTUNITY FOR THE PRESENTATION OF VIEWS OF DUGGAN AND PUTNAM ON THE CAMPAIGN AS COMPARED TO A QUOTE MINIMAL OPPORTUNITY AFFORDED TO OPPOSING VIEWPOINTS UNQUOTE AND, THAT FROM TIME TO TIME, QUOTE PERSONAL ATTACKS ON INDIVIDUALS AND GROUPS INVOLVED IN THE GUBERNATORIAL CAMPAIGN AND SPECIFICALLY ON GOVERNOR BROWN UNQUOTE WERE MADE. IN THIS SPECIFIC CONTEXT YOU WERE FURTHER ADVISED QUOTE UNDER THE FAIRNESS DOCTRINE, WHEN A BROADCAST

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STATION PERMITS, OVER ITS STATION FACILITIES, A COMMENTATOR OR ANY PERSON OTHER THAN A CANDIDATE TO TAKE A PARTISAN POSITION ON THE ISSUES INVOLVED IN A RACE FOR POLITICAL OFFICE AND/OR TO ATTACK ONE CANDIDATE OR SUPPORT ANOTHER BY DIRECT OR INDIRECT IDENTIFICATION, THEN IT SHOULD SEND A TRANSCRIPT OF THE PERTINENT CONTINUITY IN EACH SUCH PROGRAM TO THE APPROPRIATE CANDIDATES IMMEDIATELY AND SHOULD OFFER A COMPARABLE OPPORTUNITY FOR AN APPROPRIATE SPOKESMAN TO ANSWER THE BROADCAST. UNQUOTE.

IN YOUR TELEGRAM OF OCTOBER 22, 1962, YOU INFORMED THE COMMISSION THAT QUOTE EFFECTIVE AT ONCE KTTV WILL DO THE FOLLOWING: BETWEEN NOW AND ELECTION DAY WE WILL SEE TO IT THAT WITH RESPECT TO EVERY PARTISAN COMMENT CONCERNING A CANDIDATE AND ISSUES MADE ON KTTV BY A PERSON OTHER THAN A CANDIDATE DURING THE CURRENT CAMPAIGN (OTHER THAN IN PAID-POLITICAL TIME), FULL OPPORTUNITY WILL HAVE BEEN GIVEN FOR BROADCAST OF A CONTRARY COMMENT.

NO. 2 BETWEEN NOW AND ELECTION DAY TAPES OR TRANSCRIPT OF EACH PORTION OF ANY PROGRAM ON KTTV WHICH MAY INCLUDE MATERIAL OF THE NATURE DESCRIBED IN THE TELEGRAM WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE

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PROMPTLY TO THE APPROPRIATE CANDIDATE AND COMPARABLE OPPORTUNITY FOR AN APPROPRIATE SPOKESMAN TO ANSWER WILL BE AFFORDED BY KTTV. UNQUOTE YOU STATED HOWEVER THAT THE COMMISSION'S RULING QUOTE COULD ACTUALLY RUN CONTRARY TO THE COMMISSION'S EXPRESSED DESIRE THAT STATIONS ENCOURAGE AND IMPLEMENT THE BROADCAST OF PROGRAMS DEALING WITH CONTROVERSIAL PUBLIC ISSUES, PARTICULARLY DURING ELECTION PERIODS UNQUOTE IN THAT THE RULING QUOTE SEEMS TO MEAN THAT EVERY MENTION OF A CANDIDATE OR AN ISSUE (BY ANYONE EXCEPT A CANDIDATE) IN ANY PROGRAM OF ANY KIND (INCLUDING NEWSCASTS, NEWS INTERVIEWS, NEWS DOCUMENTARIES, AND ON-THE-SPOT COVERAGE OF NEWS EVENTS SUCH AS POLITICAL CONVENTIONS) IF EITHER FAVORABLE OR UNFAVORABLE WOULD REQUIRE (1) THE SENDING OF A TRANSCRIPT OF SUCH REMARKS TO THE CANDIDATE (2) OFFERING A COMPARABLE OPPORTUNITY FOR AN APPROPRIATE SPOKESMEN TO ANSWER THE BROADCAST. UNQUOTE. AS AN ILLUSTRATION, YOU INDICATED THAT ON OCTOBER 20, 1962, YOU BROADCAST A PANEL DISCUSSION AMONG (A) THE STATE REPUBLICAN CENTRAL COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN; (B) THE STATE DEMOCRATIC CENTRAL COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN; (C) THE MAJORITY LEADER OF THE STATE

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ASSEMBLY (A DEMOCRAT); AND (D) THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE STATE SENATE (A REPUBLICAN). YOU FURTHER INDICATED THAT QUOTE DURING THE COURSE OF THIS NINETY-MINUTE DISCUSSION, THE FOUR ABOVE-NAMED PARTICIPANTS MADE MANY COMMENTS PERTAINING TO THE CANDIDATES AND THE ISSUES OF THE CURRENT GUBERNATORIAL ELECTION. UNQUOTE. AND YOU STATED THAT UNDER THE COMMISSION'S RULING QUOTE KTTV WOULD BE REQUIRED TO SEND TRANSCRIPTS OF ALL REMARKS MADE BY THESE PANEL MEMBERS TO THE OPPOSING CANDIDATE, AND ADDITIONALLY, WOULD BE REQUIRED TO ARRANGE AIRTIME FOR THE CANDIDATE OR AN APPROPRIATE SPOKESMAN TO REPLY TO THESE COMMENTS. UNQUOTE.

THE COMMISSION'S RULING, HOWEVER, MUST BE CONSTRUED IN THE CONTEXT OF THE FACTS GIVING RISE THERETO. THUS, NEWSCASTS, NEWS INTERVIEWS, ETC., OR, INDEED, THE ABOVE-MENTIONED DISCUSSION PROGRAM, WOULD NOT, AS A GENERAL MATTER AND ABSENT CONDITIONS SUCH AS THOSE DISCUSSED IN THE COMMISSION'S TELEGRAM, APPEAR TO BE ENCOMPASSED BY THE COMMISSION'S RULING. AS TO THE ABOVE-MENTIONED DISCUSSION PROGRAM, IT APPEARS THAT BOTH PARTIES WERE

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EQUALLY REPRESENTED, AND, THEREFORE, IT SEEMS CLEAR THAT OPPORTUNITY WAS AFFORDED FOR OPPOSING VIEWPOINTS ON ALL OF THE ISSUES DISCUSSED.

IN YOUR TELEGRAM OF OCTOBER 22, 1962, YOU ALSO REQUESTED A CLARIFICATION OF THE COMMISSION'S REFERENCE TO QUOTE APPROPRIATE SPOKESMEN UNQUOTE; AND, IN A TELEGRAM OF OCTOBER 23, 1962 YOU INDICATED THAT GOVERNOR BROWN MIGHT DECIDE TO RESPOND, PERSONALLY, TO THE COMMENTS AND ATTACKS THAT HAD BEEN BROADCAST ON THE DUGGAN AND PUTNAM PROGRAMS, AND YOU ASK IF, IN THIS CIRCUMSTANCE, AN QUOTE EQUAL OPPORTUNITY UNQUOTE WOULD ACCRUE TO THE OTHER GUBERNATORIAL CANDIDATES.

WITH RESPECT TO YOUR QUESTION AS TO WHO WOULD CONSTITUTE AN QUOTE APPROPRIATE SPOKESMAN UNQUOTE, YOUR ATTENTION IS INVITED TO PARAGRAPH 10 OF THE EDITORIALIZING REPORT, WHEREIN IT IS STATED THAT:

QUOTE...THE LICENSEE WILL IN EACH INSTANCE BE CALLED UPON TO EXERCISE HIS BEST JUDGMENT AND GOOD SENSE IN DETERMINING WHAT SUBJECTS SHOULD BE CONSIDERED, THE DIFFERENT

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SHADES OF OPINION TO BE PRESENTED, AND THE SPOKESMEN FOR EACH POINT OF VIEW...UNQUOTE

OF COURSE, THE SELECTION OF A SPOKESMAN MUST BE REASONABLE IN TERMS OF THE POINTS OF VIEW OR THE ISSUES TO BE DISCUSSED. WHERE A POLITICAL CANDIDATE HAS BEEN PERSONALLY ATTACKED, HE SHOULD, OF COURSE, BE GIVEN A SUBSTANTIAL VOICE IN THE SELECTION OF A SPOKESMAN TO RESPOND TO SUCH ATTACK. BOTH THE CANDIDATE AND STATION CONCERNED SHOULD BE AWARE, HOWEVER, THAT IF THE CANDIDATE WERE TO SPEAK FOR HIMSELF THIS WOULD GIVE RISE TO A RIGHT TO EQUAL OPPORTUNITY FOR ALL OTHER CANDIDATES FOR THE SAME OFFICE.

THEREFORE, THE ANSWER TO YOUR QUESTION AS TO THE EFFECTS OF A PERSONAL RESPONSE BY GOVERNOR BROWN, IS THAT SUCH AN APPEARANCE WOULD CALL INTO PLAY THE APPLICABLE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 315 OF THE COMMUNICATIONS ACT.
